4. Incomplete forms will not be taken into consideration.

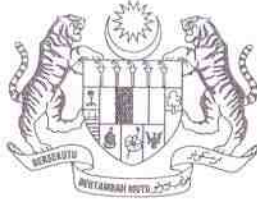

THE MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was launched in 1980 to promote and facilitate technical cooperation amongst developing countries based on the concept of self-reliance. The programme consolidates various forms of technical cooperation in areas where Malaysia has the experience and expertise. The Programme encourages the exchange of relevant experiences, pooling and sharing of resources and the development of complementary capabilities through:

- Provision of scholarship and study awards for studies at various institutions in Malaysia;
- Provision of training where participants are sponsored by third world countries or organizations;
- Study visits and practical attachments;
- Export of services and expertise in various fields

The MTCP conducted by The Centre for Foundation Studies and Extension Education (FOSEE), Multimedia University is based on the fact that the development of a country depends on the quality of its human resources. Such human resource quality can best be achieved through training. FOSEE under Multimedia University is one of the many training institutions in Malaysia involved in this training.

At present, the MTCP covers 137 developing countries (please refer the attached list or browse <http://www.epu.jpm.my/Bi/mtcp/MTCPFRAME.htm>).

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP/FELLOWSHIP AWARDS UNDER THE MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

1. General Conditions of Award:

- Participants have never participated in any MTCP or been awarded scholarships or awards under the programme.
- Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide the laws, rules and regulations of the country and Multimedia University. This scholarship cannot be held concurrently with any other scholarships or awards.
- For lectures, participants are required to be properly attired, in long-sleeved shirts with ties, tailored trousers and blazers, or uniforms. The accepted dress-codes for formal functions are suits, national costumes or "batiks". Female participants are advised to be appropriately dressed in office attire.
- Participants shall accept and participate in their approved programme. Any request for change of programme will not be entertained. Participants should actively participate in all activities carried out throughout the programme.

- Participants are not allowed to participate in any political and/or commercial activities in any capacity whatsoever. Participants shall not take up paid employment during the tenure of their scholarship or serve as the staff of their Official Representatives in Malaysia.
- Participants are NOT allowed to bring along their spouses or families for the duration of the course. Participants are required to return to their own countries upon completion of the course or at the end of the tenure of the scholarship, whichever is earlier.
- The award may be terminated at any time for reasons of unsatisfactory conduct, breaches of terms and conditions of the award, or failure to make satisfactory progress.

2. Travel Documents and Vaccination:

Persons seeking to enter Malaysia must be in possession of valid passports or other internationally recognised travel documents endorsed for travel to Malaysia. Such passports or other travel documents must be valid for at least 6 months beyond the period of stay allowed in Malaysia. In the case of a national passport not recognised by Malaysia, the holder must be in possession of a document in lieu of a passport obtained at the nearest Malaysian Mission abroad.

Travelers from certain countries are required to produce the Yellow Fever Vaccination Certificate and other health certificates at the entry point in Malaysia.

3. Terms and Condition Covered by the MTCP for International Participants:

3.1. Fares

A return air ticket on economy class is provided. This is from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur and back. Expenditures such as Visa and transit fees, excess baggage fees are to be borne by the recipients.

3.2. Maintenance Allowance

- Full board and accommodation; daily subsistence allowance
- Participants will be given an allowance, if food and accommodation are not made available, especially during the programme

3.3. Tuition Fees

Tuition fees will be borne by the Malaysian Government under the MTCP.

3.4. Medical and Dental Treatment

Expenses for medical and dental treatment in government hospitals/clinics will be borne by the Government of Malaysia. In case of admission of government hospitals will be eligible for First Class Wards (two bedded or more). Dental treatment is restricted to extraction and filling only. Candidates must be certified medically fit to participate in this programme.

3.5. Resource person

Resource persons will be local experts and people in the fields to be selected from the FOSEE, MMU senior officials.

3.6. Methods of Payment

The participants will receive allowance and other benefits as mentioned above from the Economic Planning Unit, Prime Minister's Department, Malaysia through FOSEE, MMU.

Course	: MANAGING E-UNIVERSITY: STUDY VISIT FOR SENIOR OFFICIALS
Date (Duration)	: May 16 – May 24, 2009 (9 days)
Closing Date	: April 15, 2009
Number of Participants	: 12

Course Objectives:

This course is designed to expose senior officials in the education industry on ways to manage a university, using the latest technology. The senior officials will be shown various electronic system and database management system in running a higher learning institution. The officials will be given briefings from respective departments and faculties related as well as explore the system developed.

Course Contents:

- The recipes to successfully manage a university by fully employing the available technology.
 - a. Vision/Mission/Values/Organizational Structure.
 - b. Social, political and economical perspectives of MMU to the development of Malaysia.
 - c. MMU's management style, approach and principle. The needs analysis of MMU's practices as compared to other successful universities around the globe.
 - d. Globalization and its affect in managing an internationally recognized university.
 - e. The E-Management concept of MMU.
- Forum and round table discussion on "Smart partnership and E-University in the IT era" will provide an avenue for the officials to understand effective management of a university.
- Visit and briefing by the Centre of Multimedia Education & Application Development (CMEAD). CMEAD consistently works on the latest technology in providing highly technical and specialized multimedia services. It contributes to the enhancement of departmental units in MMU by providing various multimedia support services. CMEAD's in-house products include Multimedia Learning System (MMLS), Smartcard, e-scroll, SMS service, Interactive Voice Response (IVR), Digital Imaging System and e-procurement

Course Objectives

This course introduces the fundamental concepts of electronic commerce. It is aimed at people with a basic knowledge of e-business or for those who require a 'refresher' course covering basic concepts, language and terms, and how e-business planning fits into a company's total business planning process. The course will also cover use of groupware or WWW technologies such as consultants, government and industry managers, business analysts, system designers and designers of interactive websites.

Course Content

This curriculum helps the participants to be able to define strategic directions, identify business needs, technologies, design the database requirements and system and the development process. Basically it teaches the fundamentals of Web-based application architectures, as well as some key concepts in client and server-side technologies. It gives

an introduction to e-commerce as a type of e-business and then guides the learner through Java 2, Java technologies and tools, and J2EE. This curriculum consists of three Skill Builder courses: e-business Technology Fundamentals Part 1: Architecture and Building Blocks; e-business Technology Fundamentals Part 2: e-business Applications and Technologies; e-business Technology Fundamentals Part 3: Java, Security, Web Services, and Framework. Participants will also learn how to bid on a Web site, register site names, administrate the Web development process, and help the completed online business become successful.
